Over the last few months HYA Training has experienced lots of exciting changes.

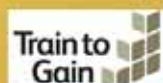
The biggest change is our expanding partnership with the NHS in Hull and East Yorkshire. Over the last 5 years this partnership has developed and grown considerably and is evident by the number of Apprenticeship and Advanced Apprenticeship starts in March - 64 to be exact!

Training programmes have been developed over the past year by working closely with the Education and Development Department at Hull and East Yorkshire Hospitals Trust. Humber Mental Health Trust, East Yorkshire PCT and City Health Care Partnership have also become involved in this joint venture.

Bespoke training programmes have been written to suit the needs and requirements of the NHS. A variety of training is currently being delivered in: Health & Social Care, Business Administration and Support Services in Healthcare. Training is predominantly delivered between the Hull Royal Infirmary, Castle Hill and Willerby Hill sites.
