The programme focuses on 16 to 18 year olds and provides training to meet individual needs and desired aims.

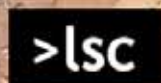
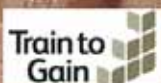

The multi-agency event aimed to break down barriers and misconceptions that surround council housing by enabling young people aged between 16 and 25 to access the service.

The event covered:-

- Housing benefits
- Getting a council property
- Homelessness services
- Maintaining a tenancy
- How to report antisocial behaviour and hate crime

Other agencies provided support, advice and information around

sexual health, getting jobs, training and apprenticeship opportunities, antisocial behaviour and reporting hate crime.
